- Foster adherence to rules and encourage respect for officials among children.
- Uphold respect for officials and their decisions. Please note that disputes based on video evidence will not be entertained.
- Extend respect towards coaches and their judgments. They generously offer their time, expertise, and experience to guide young athletes.
- Abstain from using inappropriate language or displaying unsportsmanlike behaviour directed at players, officials, or fellow spectators.
- Maintain a friendly and respectful attitude towards the opposing teams.
- Instil in children the understanding that effort and teamwork hold equal importance to victory, ensuring they accept each game's outcome without excessive disappointment.
- Transform defeats into opportunities for growth, aiding children in enhancing their skills and fostering a positive sportsmanship mentality.
- Acknowledge that TAE KWON DO COUNCIL UK events adhere to thorough safeguarding policies and procedures, which are accessible on our website.
- Embrace the spirit of enjoyment and relaxation while partaking in the event. The TAE KWON DO COUNCIL UK's goal is to facilitate competitions free from negative incidents.
